#### WORSHIP AT ST. LUKE'S

As the pandemic continues to ease, all around us life seems to be getting back to normal. Many of us have picked up old pre-Covid habits, and most of us have a sense of what precautions make sense for us, trusting that others will take precautions that make sense for them.

From Sunday to Sunday, I love seeing people who are returning to church after having been away for so long. Some people finally feel comfortable coming back, and others realize what they were missing and are ready to make regular worship part of the rhythm of their lives again.

I also love seeing new visitors from week to week. They're searching for something, and they're wondering if they might find it at St. Luke's. And it's our privilege to help them in their search.

I have long believed that when people visit a church, there are three primary things they're looking for:

- A place where they can encounter the holy, where they can meet God somehow
- A place where they can contribute to something larger than themselves, where their gifts and talents will be welcome, and where they can join in an effort that makes a difference in the world
- A place where they can develop relationships with others, relationships that will be life-giving and soul-nourishing

The more that St. Luke's can meet those desires – for the people who are already here, for members who return after a season away, and for newcomers – the more St. Luke's will thrive. I try to keep those three desires in front of me when I survey the landscape of our congregation. And I've been working with the Vestry to organize our efforts around meeting those three desires. How can we ensure that our worship provides a setting for people to feel God's presence? How can we effectively offer opportunities for people to work together to accomplish things that address the needs of the community? How can we create settings that encourage people to connect with others in meaningful ways?

Maybe you can keep those questions close to your heart this summer. If you have ideas for seeds that we can plant here, I hope you'll talk to me or someone on the Vestry or the staff. And if you know somebody with a particular longing, I hope you'll recommend St. Luke's to them. And if you haven't been to church in a while, I hope you'll come back when the time is right – you'll be able to gather with people who are guided by the Holy Spirit to illuminate San Antonio with the Light of Christ.

Enjoy this issue of Tidings, which demonstrates that there's lots going on at church these days. We have a lot to celebrate! And we have a lot to look forward to as we get ready for the future.

Transformation and Celebration CAPITAL CAMPAIGN UPDATE

At the beginning of 2021, St. Luke's Church embarked on a capital campaign to address several priorities in support of the church's mission. We have made great progress! We're almost halfway through the threeyear term of the campaign, so this is the perfect time for an update.

#### FINANCIAL SUPPORT FOR THE CAMPAIGN

The fundraising goal of the campaign was \$2 million. Pledges for the campaign exceeded that goal. Including gifts in anticipation of the campaign, we have received pledges of \$2.08 million. We appreciate so much the commitment of people who have made progress fulfilling their pledges. As of May 11, we have received actual contributions of \$1.53 million. Many donors have plans to fulfill their pledges by the end of 2023.

And if you have not yet made a pledge, there's still time to participate! Capital projects often have cost over-runs, so your pledge may

help with unanticipated costs that come up along the way.

The campaign's scope of work covers five distinct projects:



#### 1. A NEW PIPE ORGAN

Last fall marked the installation of the magnificent pipe organ constructed by the Reuter Organ Company. The organ has enhanced our worship on Sundays, and we have enjoyed a variety of recitals that have drawn people from all over San Antonio to St. Luke's Church.



#### 2. RESTORATION OF THE STAINED GLASS

The stained glass windows in the church, designed by renowned artist Cecil Casebier, are a treasure. The Great Window on the east end was restored several years ago, and we are ready to address the needs of the other windows in the Nave and Narthex.

We have engaged The Cavallini Company, a well-respected stained glass studio based here in San Antonio, known for their installations and for their restoration work on existing installations. This spring they have been getting ready for the work that is scheduled to begin in June and should last most of the summer. The scope of work will include:

- Replacing existing protective covers with new Plexiglas covers, and incorporating vent hoods and weep holes to address condensation issues
- Cleaning the frames of the windows
- Replacing missing and loose glazing putty between stained glass and frames
- Repairing or replacing severely broken panes of glass
- Reduce bulging in the glass
- Stabilizing lead overlays and replacing missing lead overlays with black cold paint or lead
- Cleaning interior and exterior of stained glass sides by wiping away loose dirt and grime

Adrian J. Cavallini, president of the family-owned studio, is excited about taking on this project, which has special significance for him. "Having collaborated with Cecil during the 90s," he says, "it's an honor and privilege to restore one of his monumental creations at St. Luke's Church."



When the work is completed, people can expect a dramatic change in the light that comes through the protective covers. People will also notice a significant enhancement in the beauty of the stained glass.

All the work will take place on-site. This important work will ensure that our stained glass is well-preserved for future generations, helping us continue to tell the story of God's movement in our lives and in the world.

#### 3. HVAC MAINTENANCE AND UPGRADES

With our aging infrastructure, we know that we need to address components of our HVAC system that are nearing the end of their lifespan. We were able to upgrade the system, converting a two-pipe chilling and heating system to a more-efficient four-pipe system. We still hope also to set aside some funds in a restricted account that will generate income to cover expenses well into the future.

#### 4. LANDSCAPING AND EXTERIOR IMPROVEMENTS

It is very desirable to have a master plan for our campus, addressing landscaping and hardscaping possibilities, as well as issues like parking and accessibility. We look forward to working with leadership at St. Luke's School to enhance our landscaping and exterior features, to help people make better use of the grounds and to improve our "curb appeal". One requirement for a master plan is a current property survey that illustrates the locations of all the trees, topography, and all site improvements. We got that survey done in late 2021, and anticipate more progress in this area soon.

#### 5. PARLOR UPDATE

We are also planning to refresh the Parlor and adjoining spaces, including the kitchenette and the restrooms, so that this space will serve as an attractive setting for fellowship on Sundays and for special events and receptions throughout the week. The Vestry is waiting until later to finalize the scope of work and the process for this remodeling.

All of these projects enhance our campus in significant ways, ensuring that our buildings and grounds are just the right setting for the mission and ministry of St. Luke's Episcopal Church and School. We will provide more updates as we continue to make progress on these projects. If you ever have questions, feel free to talk to any member of the Vestry.

#### **BIBLE STUDY: PHILIPPIANS**

At the start of 2022, Bishop David Reed called the Diocese of West Texas to study Ephesians and Philippians in 2022. During Pre-Council meetings, Bishop Reed shared the following reflection about these two Letters, "Paul's beautiful descriptions of the essential nature of the church renews hope and calls on us to look higher, to remember God's purposes in the midst of our daily work. The letters also speak to churches that are threatened by outside forces, by things beyond their control. They recall us to trust in the living Christ who gives us strength to resist despair. Both letters echo our theme of building up."

In light of Bishop Reed's recommendation to read these beautiful epistles, we will be studying the book of Philippians using a guide written by the Rev. Dr. Jane Lancaster Patterson and the Rev. Dr. John G. Lewis. These studies were originally written in 2011 and 2013 for congregations in the Diocese of West Texas.

Class begins on July 3rd at 10am in the Large Conference Room. No reading required.

#### PRAYER SQUARE INITIATIVE: JULY 24TH INGATHER-Ing

As part of ongoing efforts to walk alongside our migrant neighbors, the Diocese of West Texas' Immigration Ministries is launching the Episcopal Prayer Square Initiative. Individuals and families are invited to create prayer squares, following the instructions below, and then bring them to St. Luke's by July 24th, when we will bless them before delivering them to the Bishop Jones Center. Each prayer square will be given to migrants at bus stations throughout the Diocese of West Texas, as part of a Travel Kit that includes shelf-stable food and Personal Protective Equipment (PPE). Each square will be a small, tangible way for us to accompany our neighbors, providing a warm welcome and continued hope for them as they continue their journey.

#### **Episcopal Prayer Square Initiative**



Join Immigration Ministries, the Diocese of West Texas, and Episcopalians throughout our neighboring border dioceses, as we share love, support our siblings-in-Christ, and honor our call as Christians to serve our neighbor. Each prayer square will be given to migrants at bus stations throughout the Diocese, as part of a Travel Kit, including shelf-stable food and Personal Protective Equipment (PPE).

#### **Prayer Square Instructions**

- Knit, crochet, or cut fabric into 3.5 by 3.5 inch squares.
- Decorate the prayer square with fabric paint, permanent markers, stickers, yarn, or other art supplies. Consider illustrating a cross, hearts, ichthys (the Christian fish symbol), or other uplifting designs showing love and support without words.
- Write a short note of love and encouragement in English (50 words or less), then translate it into Spanish or Haitian Creole using Google Translate, at translate.google.com, or another translation program.
- Type and print the translated message, or print clearly, then fold the paper into a small square.
- Attach the note of encouragement to the prayer square using a safety pin, ribbon, or thread. Consider asking your priest to bless the prayer squares, too.
- Send or hand-deliver completed prayer squares to Immigration Ministries, at the address below.

#### **Churchwide Prayer Square Drive**

- Ask your priest to host a church-wide prayer square drive.
- Designate a Sunday to collect prayer squares and bless them during the service. Consider distributing pre-assembled Prayer Square Kits, including all supplies needed, to congregants ahead of time.
- Send or hand-deliver all collected prayer squares in a large envelope or box, to Immigration Ministries at the address below.
- Document the names of each person who made a prayer square, and the total number of squares submitted by each person. Ask individuals if they would like to share their contact information (name, email address, phone number, etc.) with Immigration Ministries, and include that list with the squares.

The Parable of Chasing Sheep is one most of us know well. Since Covid things have pretty much returned to (a new) normal and the pace has really picked up. During August 2021 our fantastic new organ was installed and we began a new Arts Series to celebrate it and the ministry of music we offer to any and everyone. The organ was dedicated in November, our Choir sang Handel's Messiah in December, we hosted the Texas Children's Choir, the Kansas Symphony organist Jan Kraybill played in March, our Artists-in-Residence IlluMen sang in April, and the phenomenal Alcee Chriss gave a Celebrity Concert in May, and he brought the house down.



There's still a lot to do as the term winds down. Covid is still working its way through the Choir. Nevertheless, there is the first organ recording to get down on disc, then the Choir is making a new recording in June: *Sing My Soul*. This will be a set of



A-Cappella Motets following the seasons of the liturgical year. That's a fancy way of saying "your favorite unaccompanied anthems." I like to provide constant goals to keep a focus and make us stretch. The CD is also a fundraiser to get the Choir over to Dublin where we are singing in-residence at St. Patrick's National Cathedral, July 2023.

It takes effort, and sometimes you wonder if it's worth the expenditure. Well, yes, it is. You have to push forwards, and if you don't you're standing still, and standing still means you're lagging behind. So we ask for your support. We believe there's something of transformative value in what we have to offer; something that can feed you.
