THE DAWN CHORUS

INTERGENERATIONAL ADVENT SERIES



Songbirds know a thing or two about singing into darkness: in the wee hours of the morning, before the sun appears over the horizon, they begin a great symphony that scientists call the "dawn chorus." Advent is the church's dawn chorus. Each Sunday of Advent we will walk through The Dawn Chorus devotional as a parish family, concluding with activity stations for all ages, and the singing of hymns.

FROM THE RECTOR



One of the privileges of my role as Rector of St. Luke's Church is supporting the work of St. Luke's School, one of the Church's most visible ministries to the community. I worked with two successive interim Heads of School in my first year here, and in 2020 we welcomed Dr. Chelsea Collins as its new head.

In early November, the School announced that Chelsea has accepted an invitation to become the next Head of School of St. Francis' Episcopal School in Houston, beginning next summer. See the official announcement to the right. This is an exciting opportunity for Chelsea: St. Francis' School is a large school with grades pre-K through 12, and her time at St. Luke's has prepared her well for this new setting. We can celebrate this opportunity that Chelsea has accepted.

We also celebrate what Chelsea has accomplished during her time here. She accepted the position at St. Luke's in late 2019, but her time here didn't start until summer 2020. You can probably remember the uncertainty and anxiety at that point in the pandemic. But she arrived and worked with faculty and decided to return to in-person instruction in fall 2020. I remember vividly what a bold decision that was for a school head new to the community at that time.

Chelsea will remain at St. Luke's School through May, and she is committed to continue strengthening the school. She has overseen a time of remarkable strengthening for the School. Enrollment has increased

significantly, she has recruited numerous talented faculty and administrators, and she has worked with the Board of Trustees to approve an ambitious Strategic Plan that will serve as an important resource in the coming years for the next Head of School. In the future, people will look on Chelsea's time at St. Luke's as a period of great flourishing for the School.

The Board of Trustees has formed a Search Committee, of which I am a member. We will engage an Interim Head of School for the 2023-24 school year, with expectations of the next permanent Head starting in summer 2024. The School is in a dramatically stronger position than it was just a few years ago, and we know the position will be very attractive to strong candidates. I'm excited about what lies ahead.

The enrollment season for the next year has begun. As you think about schools for children in your family, or if you have friends or neighbors who are wondering about schools for their children, I hope you'll consider St. Luke's. And of course, I encourage any parishioner who is curious about what's going on at the School these days to arrange for a tour: they love showing off all that happens there during the school days.

I'll look forward to providing regular updates as we prepare for this important transition at the School. Please reach out to me if you ever have questions.

Dr. Collins will remain in her position at St. Luke's until the conclusion of her contract on May 31. We celebrate this opportunity for Dr. Collins to lead a larger school, all while remaining dedicated to the Episcopal School education model. Please join us in celebrating and congratulating her.

St Luke's is grateful to have benefited from Dr. Collins' transformative leadership and her immeasurable contributions to our community. She has given of herself generously and has been instrumental in continuing to build St. Luke's into one of the premier independent schools in San Antonio.

Our school is well poised for the future. St. Luke's is supported by gifted and inspiring teachers who work tirelessly to ensure that SLES is a learning community where every child is known and can thrive. We are blessed by a talented and committed administrative team, a highly engaged board of trustees, and a strong partnership with families. We have a very special culture at St. Luke's, one of love, respect, and support for each other. We are confident these qualities will attract another top caliber Head of School.

In the coming weeks, we will be interviewing several national search firms to help us identify a well



qualified Interim for 2023-24 academic year and a long-term Head of School to begin in 2024. There is a pool of extremely qualified candidates that will bring a wealth of experience and continue to advance our strategic initiatives and our academic program. Dr. Collins is committed to working with faculty, staff, and the Board to ensure a smooth transition.

After the Interim is hired, we will begin a national search for our permanent Head of School. This search will be a transparent and inclusive process with broad community input from parents, faculty and staff, students, alumni, St. Luke's Church and other key stakeholders. This process will be guided by a search committee representing different constituencies of the St Luke's community. Updates on this process will be shared with the school community.

The future of St. Luke's Episcopal School is bright and we will continue to build on our 75-year-old legacy of educating scholars, citizens, and leaders. Thank you for your ongoing support and trust with your children.



REFLECTION

NANCY HAWKINS

I love this time of year, and I always have. It's a little complicated. To me it is a time that at once anticipates endings and beginnings. We are pushed and pulled in different directions, and yet this time seems to lend itself to quiet reflection.

We have passed Halloween, and started the downhill slope toward the end of the calendar year with the sort of bustle that accompanies winding up all the things that must be completed, dated, stamped and turned in by the end of the year, and the preparation of the celebrations that accompany this time. At St. Luke's we are finishing up with our Stewardship campaign, and doing the work to find a new class of Vestry members.

The liturgical year is quietly drawing to a close. The long period of green hangings and Ordinary time will soon give way to the purple of Advent and the anticipation of Christmas. Year C of the 3-year cycle of the church is ending, and we will start all over again with year A.

I am ending my own 3-year cycle soon as a member of the vestry, and since Advent is a season for reflection and preparation, this seems like a fitting time to reflect on serving on the vestry.

It's complicated. I am feeling grateful both for the end of my term and for the chance to have served in this way. I have run for vestry three times. Each term I have served has offered me an opportunity to deepen my faith in ways that I had not really expected. Just accepting the "ask" to run for vestry challenged me each time to let go and let God. It challenged me to allow myself to be OK whichever way things went. Vestry challenged me to say yes to the faith that others had in me, that God had in me, even when I doubted my own abilities. Their faith in me, increased my own faith. Serving on the vestry helped me to learn to listen to others, even when I didn't agree with them, and to love them.

And while serving on the vestry is doing the business of the church, I have found it to be so much more. Yes, it can be tedious, sometimes tense (not going to lie, that would be sinful), it is also joyful and fulfilling to be serving the church in this way.

So, I am anticipating both the end of my vestry time, and the beginning of "regular parishioner" time with gratitude and increased faith. And I encourage you, when you are asked to consider serving on the vestry, that you have that faith that others have in you, that God has in you, and say, "Yes."







Greetings to the congregation of St. Luke's! I'm very excited to be stepping into the role of Director of Youth Ministries, and am grateful to have the opportunity to help support the youth of the parish as they learn and grow in their faith journeys.

I thought it might be helpful if you know a little bit about me to help you get to know me better. I'm a native of San Antonio, and happy to be back in my home town after living in various other states including Montana and Nebraska. I attended Montana State University and received my degree in Anthropology. During my time in college, I was involved with the youth group of my local Episcopal Church, and since graduation I have continued working with youth in the field of education. My most recent position being the Education Director and Artifact Curator for the Chisholm Trail Heritage Museum in Cuero, TX.

This fall the youth group has been off to a great start with classes focused on exploring the stories of St. Luke's Church, and helping the youth connect deeper with their faith lives. A major focus has also been placed on strengthening fellowship, both between the youth and with the wider congregation. For the remainder of this year the youth group will have many ministry groups of the parish visit as guest speakers, including the Ushers, Altar Guild, and Mediation Group as a way for the youth to explore what the life of the parish looks like and form new intergenerational connections. I would like to offer my deepest thanks to all the members of our St. Luke's community who have and are assisting with this vital ministry and I am grateful to all members of the parish.

With the start of the new year, youth group will continue on Sundays from 5:00-6:30 pm and will now be combined middle and high school. Beginning January 11, a new offering for high school youth will begin called "Theology on Screen", Wednesday nights from 5:30-7:00 pm. This new program will focus on the theology present in both movies and TV and allow for a deeper exploration of our faith lives and the questions brought up by depictions of faith in popular culture. Programming for Sunday youth group will be focused on continuing to strengthen fellowship through volunteer events, group outings, and engaging with the larger parish life. One of our first major outings will be a youth overnight lock in and trip to hike Enchanted Rock in January. Planning is also ongoing for a multi-day youth mission trip scheduled for later in the Spring.

Faith formation hour is continuing from 10-10:50 am on Sundays in the youth room. This year we will be using a lectionary curriculum that connects the youth to the daily readings, which I hope allows for a deeper contemplation of the Holy Scripture we hear on Sundays.

As we prepare to enter this new year and expand the opportunities for youth ministry, we greatly welcome all volunteers interested in working with the youth group. If you are interested, please reach out to me anytime, and my door is always open if you have any questions. The youth of St. Luke's are truly incredible and show a passion for understanding the work Christ has called us to. I thank you all for the opportunity to be a part of this ministry and look forward to the coming year of growing in Christ together.

THE SACRAMENT OF HOLY COMMUNION AT HOME

Each Sunday morning, one or two of your fellow parishioners, called Lay Eucharistic Visitors (LEVs), take Holy Communion to members of our church who are unable to attend worship services in person but who continue, despite their physical absence, to be part of the body of believers that is St. Luke's. Taking the consecrated elements to these dear parishioners is a privilege and an honor for the LEVs.

A short service, usually including readings, prayers, confession and the administration of communion occurs in the recipient's place of residence. The service can be modified depending upon the preference of the recipient and the time available. The gifts of the bread and wine, the bread of life and the cup of salvation, are contained in a special, beautiful kit with a small silver chalice and a paten (plate for the bread). LEVs are specially trained and licensed for this ministry.

We who are many are one body, because we all share one bread, one cup.

Recipients of home communion include any parishioner who, because of health issues or other reasons, is unable to worship with us in person. They may refer themselves for home communion or a family member may request that a loved one be added to the list of recipients. Temporary recipients might be recovering from surgery, for example, and plan to return to

church in person after a couple of months. Those who are ministered to indefinitely may be in a long-term care facility or be homebound because of physical limitations.

We are here to help one another and to be connected as a community; please don't be shy about asking for a LEV visit.

MUSTARD SEED

The Mustard Seed has had a great start to the school year. We look forward to the bright, smiling faces of our students each and every day. Our teachers and children have all settled into the daily routine and activities. The children enjoy weekly chapel where they have learned Bible stories starting with Creation and up to Jonah thus far. Chapel includes prayer time and songs, as well.



Our Shepherd's classroom is for our youngest students who are 18 months - 2 years old at the beginning of the school year. For many of these children, this is their first time in school. Our Angel's classroom is for our older students who are 2 ½ - 3 years old at the start of the school year. Our Angel's classroom begins each day with class meeting which is a fun time to greet one another and sing. Miss Maggie and Miss Kelly plan fun and educational math, science and literature activities for their students. Some of their favorite activities in October are learning about echolocation and exploring pumpkins.

FINANCIAL REPORT
